The Kanios' will travel a bit and enjoy getting back to full retirement. What love and devotion they have given to our church! Their granddaughter, **Keri Hempelman**, will join her Aunt Mary in carrying on this family tradition of dusting pews, mopping floors and straightening piles on the minister's desk!

Everyone else remains in place! However, our program staff (budgeted for 2007 at \$16,000) will include four staff people. **Heidi Jenkins** will lead an expanded congregational care area (including Outreach, member assimilation, development of special projects, training of leaders and managing our Care Ministry). She will also continue her role as Children's Music Director.

Chris Boon has been hired as Children's Ministry Director. She'll staff that team and work collaboratively with **Tracey Van Ryzin**, who will continue her administrative role with the Church School.

Jen Schulz has agreed to take on the role of Youth Director. In addition to teaching 7th grade confirmation, she will provide leadership to Youth Corp, Coffeehouse and our overall 7th-12th grade programming.

Finally, **Rochelle McInerney**, will assume the role of Missions and Activities Director. She will staff the Mission Team, A.C.E. (Activities, Community & Entertainment) and oversee a number of small group programs.

One of them, for the specific date in August, was quite easy to track down since the amount involved was somewhat unusual. However, the other one, for \$30 on March 20, could not be identified because there were two many other contributions for that same amount given on the date involved.

For the future, I'd like to ask that each one of us check our Statements carefully to see if any contributions were *incorrectly* assigned to our account. This could be quite easy for many of us to do because we generally give the same amount each time, except for the Special Offerings at Lent, Thanksgiving and Christmas etc.

Church Council Highlights **November 14, 2006**

Treasurer's Report: Leslie reported that the monthly revenue for October was \$34,622 and the monthly expenses were \$24,930. \$660 of the building maintenance expenses were for the AHU. Building fund checking account and the money market account totals \$15,400 which is being held as reserves and will be evaluated at the end of the year where it should be put. \$4,600 of the \$6,619 deferred reserves are part of the 2007 pledges and will be rolled into the 2007 revenues. Leslie recommended after the pledges are in, that we should determine what the loan amortization should be, based on the fixed interest rate, and a specific monthly payment amount can be set. The disbursement of the memorial funds is being tracked and reported

Pastor's Report:

- Franz met with the staff relations committee, shared the staff inner circles and announced some staff changes: Chris Boon will be the new Children's Ministry Director, Tracey Van Ryzin will continue as Church School Administrator, Keri Hempelman was added along with Mary Johnson who will resume the custodial duties, John Reiter was named music director, Rochelle McInerney will support the mission's and A.C.E. committees, Jen Schultz will be the new Youth Director and Heidi Jenkins will focus on congregational life and care ministry, including outreach, development and training.
- Ed Proctor bought pens to pass out as part of the outreach program
- Franz would like to see the council involved in relational updates with congregation.

Old Business:

- Faith Drive update: 183 pledges to date of \$265,556, need additional \$35,000 to meet projected budget. Will e-mail or call 50 members in the next two days to remind them to submit their pledge and will follow up on Tuesday and Wednesday of next week with additional reminders if necessary. Leslie will write thank you to Heidi Jenkins for her great power point presentation which was very successful and Deb will write thank you to Kathy Ellenbecker for the great meals she prepared for all of the faith drive programs.
- Membership: Out of 530 members, we had 52 new members, including confirmands and 12 members who have left or are inactive and Franz will write a letter asking if they wish to continue as members.
- Nominations update: Warner will meet with Franz next week to go over vacancies and potential nominees for the committees.

New Business:

- Annual Meeting: December 10, we will vote on budget and nominations.
- Leadership Retreat: Overnight Jan 26-27
- Kurt's Storage: Tom, Warner and Eric will contact Kurt Eick to help clean out church things stored in his barn.
