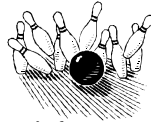

REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT REPORT

Pilgrim Church has been helping the Htoo/Paw family for 15 months now and we are happy to report that they are very self-sufficient. On June 22nd, several of us helped the family move from 60th and Bradley to a Southside apartment located on West Oklahoma Avenue which is very near family and friends.



To quote a phrase that Hton Naya, their 5 year old, said several times that day **"WE DID IT!"** When they came from the Thailand refugee camp, they carried all of their belongings in just two suitcases. Since they had never experienced a move like this before, we showed her the basics and Htee Sher had all of the packing done when we arrived around 8am. One load was already on its way to the new apartment in their friends' truck. We dodged the raindrops and it turned out to be quite a sunny day.

Bert Faase provided his covered trailer for two runs. Heidi Jenkins used her trailer and had the help of three strong young men to bring many of the large items. Sue Steckel, Pam Paul, Cindy Heisdorf and I completed the Pilgrim moving team.

At one point, Hton Naya asked when they were going home. He was so happy when he was told that he was home and that they would be sleeping there that night and every night. It made us feel so good to see the children playing outside with their cousins. Htee Sher has had two brothers move to Milwaukee with their families and they all live within a half mile of each other. Now they can share childcare which was a problem for them when they lived on 60th Street.

The apartment was in good shape when the last of the moving team left at 5pm. Just before that, when we were assembling the children's bunk beds, Htee Sher looked up from the frame she was holding while Say Hler and Sue tightened the bolts and said that her family will never forget all of the people from Pilgrim that helped her family so much. They are so thankful for everything that has been done for their family.

Getting to know this family has been a very satisfying experience for the entire refugee resettlement committee. We've learned so much and continue to learn from them. She once told me that she was so sad that she didn't have anything to give us to say Thank You. She brought herself and her family into our lives and we told her that that was the best gift of all.

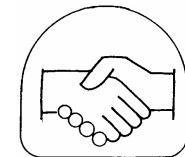
